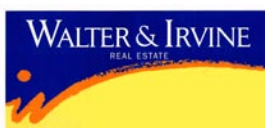

## Round 12 B Grade

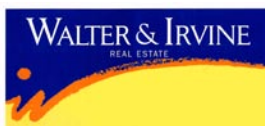
### **Adelaide Lutheran 24.25 (169) thumped Smithfield 1.2 (8)**

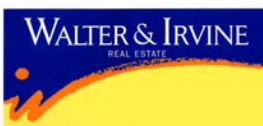
On that note well done to the organizers of the recent Safari Night, apparently those who made it had a wild time.
